


Good Bye Signal Sound Sound Stands St

This year in Year 3, the children have been on an exciting journey of learning across a wide range of subjects.


In English, we explored the magical world of *The BFG* and unravelled the mystery of *The Pied Piper*, developing their storytelling and comprehension skills.
