Robins class news



Robins have continued to work hard while continuing our topic of 'superheroes'. We have been looking at describing superheroes in detail and making sure that we use finger spaces, full stops and capital letters in our writing. We have really worked hard on our letter formation, our letters are becoming much neater and our work is looking beautiful!

We have been looking at number 9 and 10 in maths. We have been on a number hunt in the classroom, hall and outside area to find these numbers in our environment. We have been using our prior knowledge to help us look at one more and one less in more detail and we will be investigating the composition of numbers 1-10.

In PE we are continuing to work on our fundamental skills and listening skills. We have been looking at how to start and stop moving safely to ensure we can negotiate a space safely with consideration of others.

We have been learning all about St Patricks day and Red Nose Day too!



In English this week we have started our new book 'Yeti and the Bird'. We have been working on using the -est suffix to describe the Yeti in the story, by using words like 'biggest', scariest' and 'hairiest'.

In Maths, we have started our new topic 'length and height'. We started off by measuring things with objects (cubes), before learning how to use a ruler. As it was such a lovely day today, we decided to take the rulers outside and measure things that we found on the field!

In Computing, we have been practising the skill of logging on and logging off the chrome books. We have been learning how to type capital letters and use spaces. We then played a game that helped us to practise suing the track pad.

This week in Maths we have been continuing our learning looking at measurement but with a focus on capacity and volume. We have learnt how to read scales in millilitres and litres and how to compare measurements.

In DT we continue to work towards making our own hand puppets. Last week we designed what we wanted our hand puppets to look like based on a story character. This week in readiness for making our puppets, we have looked at how we can join material. We experimented with joining material with PVA glue, a stapler and have learnt how to do a running stitch. We decided that this would be the best way of joining our material to make our hand puppets.

In RE we have been thinking about the question: why Christians call 'Good Friday' for the day Jesus died. We learnt that although it's a sad day for Christians, they call it "Good Friday" because they believe that Jesus died to save everyone from their sins and Jesus was their saviour.

In PSHE, we recapped some learning we did earlier in the year in Computing about how to stay safe online. We were reminded of the importance about not talking to people we do not known whilst online and not to give out personal information.

We have been having lots of fun learning how to create high quality descriptions of story characters in English recently and have worked very hard to demonstrate some excellent creative techniques. We are very proud of our work so far and are becoming more confident in sharing our work with others.

In maths we continue to work through our fractions unit. We are nearly finished so soon we will begin our unit on decimals. We are finding the better at times tables we are, the more confident we are feeling about fractions work so keep up all the practise!

In Science, we have begun to explore food chains and the different elements that make a food chain up. We will also be discussing what happens when an organism from a food chain disappears and how human actions and climate change are often the reason for a food chain being disrupted. We will explore the far-reaching consequences of something in a food chain being disrupted.

In art we have begun some research and preparations for some printing work - we are inspired by some ancient Greek art and have looked to the 'geometric period' in particular. We can't wait to begin our finished piece.
